Further to your request, we are pleased to provide the information contained in Longines' handwritten registers:

The original serial number 4'254'028 identifies a pocket watch in metal. It is fitted with a Longines manually wound mechanical movement, caliber 18.49 and was invoiced on 28 January 1926 to the company Perusset, which was at that time our agent for South America.

For your information, the engravings were made after the watch left the factory and we have no information about the use of this timepiece.

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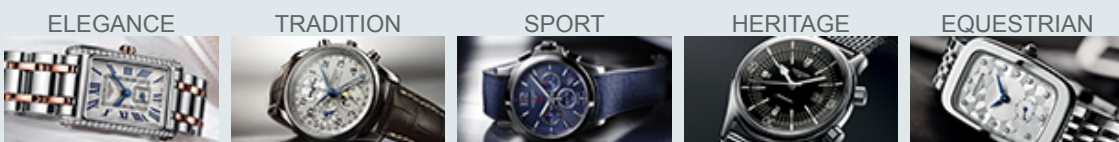
